CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

MAJOR CONSTRUCTION HAS BEGUN

Here is an approximate time-table of the renovations:

6/20 & 21: Pews were removed

6/22 & 23: Abatement was done

6/24: Scaffolding was erected

6/27 and forward: Ceiling will be cleaned and painted

-Pendant fixtures will be cleaned and refurbished

-New ceiling lighting will be installed to replace the existing floodlights so that the lighting in the sanctuary is more evenly dispersed

After completion of the first half of the sanctuary ceiling:

-Move scaffolding

-Install floor tile

-Reset pews

After completion of the first half of the sanctuary:

-Repeat the above process on the other side

After all the above is complete, the wood baseboard will be installed, followed by the installation of the new carpet.

By the end of summer, the carpet for the chancel should be available to be installed.

Then it will be time to celebrate and rejoice!



SANCTUARY RENOVATION & RESTORATION

SANCTUARY RENOVATION & RESTORATION

Ascension's sanctuary will be undergoing restoration and renovation over the summer months. Projects include the cleaning and painting of our ceiling, removal of asbestos tile under our pews, and the installation of a new hard floor under the pews. During this time of improvements, we'll be using chairs for seating in addition to our pews. Thank you for your patience as we seek to restore, and improve, our sanctuary. We thank God for this opportunity to beautify His house, and we thank you for your continued support of Ascension's capital campaign.

PROJECT RENEW-A-PEW

PROJECT RENEW-A-PEW HAS BEGUN! At the start of the Capital Campaign (before Covid) the budgeted cost to refurbish the pews was approximately \$12,000.00. But, because the cleaning and sanitizing of the pews during 2020 removed a great deal of the luster of the pews, the pews will need a lot more loving care, labor, and therefore money, to get them looking great again. (The pews that have already been done look super!)

Even though we received a generous donation for the pew restoration, the remaining need averages \$600.00 per pew. If you would like to help restore any portion of a pew - or a whole new pew – there are three different ways you can contribute:

1. Take an envelope and a "piece of a pew" from the board in the narthex. Put your contribution and the piece of the pew in the collection box in the narthex. **[OR]**
2. Use the blue-bordered envelope for special offerings that is in your envelope box. Clearly mark the envelope and your check for "Renew-A-Pew". Put the contribution in the collection box in the narthex. **[OR]**
3. Mail a check to Ascension with "Renew-A-Pew" noted in the memo line. **[OR]**
4. Give online thru the Online Giving tab at ascensionstl.com or thru the Vanco Mobile App

As contributions are received, the display board in the narthex will be filled in to show how many pews have been funded. Every \$150.00 pays for a quarter of a pew, but no contribution is too small. Please help us reach our goal of having all the pews refurbished by this fall!
